Ventura County Healthcare Agency 2018 Healthcare for the Homeless

- 12,618 persons enrolled in County of Ventura's Healthcare for the Homeless program.
- 4,007 (32%) persons met the HUD definition of homeless.

Ventura County Office of Education 2018 School District Data

- 5,291 students identified as homeless in Ventura County.
- 538 (10%) students met the HUD definition of homeless























INCOME NEEDED TO RENT IN VENTURA COUNTY

- The Social Security Income (SSI) maximum payment for an individual is \$931.72/month
- Rent affordable to a SSI recipient is \$279/month
- Minimum wage is \$12.00/hour. Rent affordable to a minimum wage worker is \$624/month
